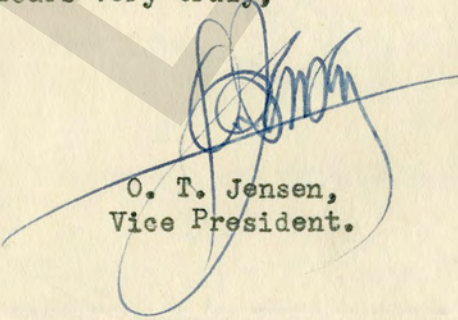

I find that your note is still past due in our files. You will, of course, recall that this loan was originally made to you December 10, 1938 upon General Calles' endorsement, and it was understood that the loan would be liquidated shortly.

Since no payment has been made on the principal it occurs to us to be in order that we should call on you at this time to properly adjust this matter. We are extremely disappointed that you have failed to acknowledge our notices and letters to you in connection with this obligation.

Please, therefore, be advised that unless arrangements are made without further delay to liquidate this debt it will be necessary for us to take appropriate action to enforce payment. Such action would be exceedingly distasteful in that it would be necessary for us to name General Calles as a party to the obligation as well. May I suggest that you adjust this matter without further delay.

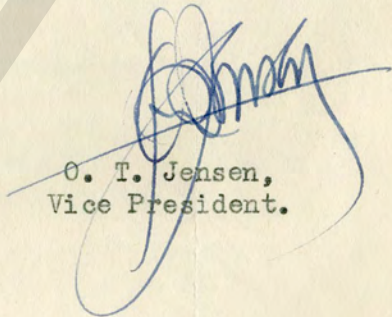

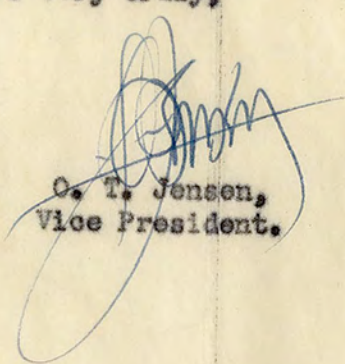
It is extremely disturbing to us not to have you respond to our letter of January 6 in which we referred to your loan of \$1,000, which matured on December 2.
