Dear Sister Pius:

There has been so much to do since we arrived here that I have not had the opportunity to refer to your kind card of last May 21st. until today.

I wish to thank you for the kind expressions you had for the General and myself in your cadr of reference, and sincerely hope your prayers will be heard by the Lord. Speaking for myself, I am certainly glad to have someone as yourself pray for us. I feel highly honored by this fact.

Mr. and Mrs. Torreblanca are already in that country. They went for two of their daughters who are studying in Ramona Convent, Alhambra, California, and they should be in your school for the boys very shortly now. They will take care of the bills that may be pending.

Sister, I will ask you to do me a favor, if you please. Before we left San Diego, I received a bill from the Johnston Clinic. This bill was paid by me, that is, I mailed the General's check to the clinic around the first day of last May. The check I mailed was for \$4.00, it was numbered 769, on the Bank of America, San Diego, California and dated April 29, 1941. When the Gen. received his statement from the Bank, this was the only check that was not returned. The clinic has just sent another bill for the same amount, and this makes me believe there is something wrong about the whole thing. If the Clinic did not receive the check, I will cancell payment on it and mail a new one. Will you please find out about this, Sister, and let me know? I am enclosing the bill to you for your convenience.
