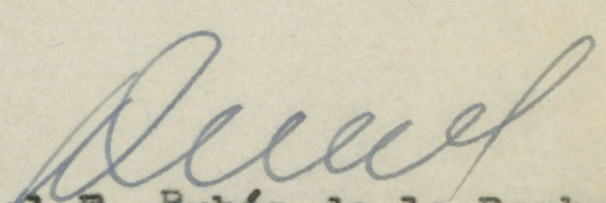
Muy distinguido y fino amigo:

Dear Professor Kirkland:

The American Historical Association at its annual meeting last December agreed to sponsor the First Congress of Historians of Mexico and the United States, which is scheduled to be held in Monterrey September 4-9 of this year. The Association appointed a committee to cooperate with the Mexican historical associations concerned in the organization of the Congress. On behalf of this committee and of the Academia de Ciencias Históricas in Monterrey and the Instituto Nacional de Antropología e Historia of Mexico City I am writing to inquire whether you would be able to participate in this Congress.

What we have in mind is devoting one session to Economic History, to be presided over by Dr. Daniel Cosío Villegas, a well known Mexican scholar. Two principal papers are planned of approximately thirty minutes in length. Sr. Victor Urquidí is being invited to present a paper on Economic Relations between Mexico and the United States in the Twentieth Century and we are hoping very much that you will consent to give a paper on the topic: Worldwide Economic Expansion of the United States in the Twentieth Century. It was felt here that such a general presentation of the economic expansion of the United States would provide a good background against which to understand the economic relations between two countries. Professor C.H. Haring of Harvard University is being invited to serve as Discussant for the two papers, after which it is expected that there will be other discussion from the floor. This session is planned for Tuesday, September 6.

The Academy of Historical Sciences of Monterrey has kindly offered to pay for the living expenses of the persons participating in the Congress at the rate of thirty-five pesos per day for the six days of the Congress. Dr. Guy Stanton Ford, Executive Secretary of the American Historical Association, will write to your college president expressing the hope that he will find it possible to

assist in connection with the travel expenses to and from Monterrey, but we first of all wanted to find out whether this idea appeals to you. May I add that there is great interest in Mexico in your presence at the Congress because the Spanish translation of your work has made your contributions well known to historians here. Inasmuch as this is the first Congress my committee is eager that the United States delegation be as representative as possible and I hope very much, therefore, that you will find it possible to accept.

Dear Mr. Haring:

Enclosed is a copy of my letter to Prof. Kirkland, which is self-explanatory, I believe. We hope very much that you will consent to serve as Discussant at the session described in the letter. Perhaps I should explain that what we are hoping for is a ten or fifteen minute paper in which you would comment and raise questions in such a way that the subsequent general discussion would be lively and interesting.

The Academy of Historical Sciences of Monterrey has kindly offered to pay the living expenses of persons participating in the program at the rate of thirty-five pesos per day for the six days of the Congress. If we are fortunate enough to obtain some funds from one of the several foundations we have appealed to, it is my purpose to recommend to our committee that these funds be applied toward assisting United States historians on the program with their travel expenses to and from Monterrey. Thus far, I regret to report, our efforts have been unsuccessful, but I intend to press this matter as vigorously as I can.

Enclosed is a copy of my letter to Prof. Brinton, and I hope that you will use your influence in the right direction.

Yesterday we visited Irving Leonard and his wife in Cuernavaca. They have just arrived and will be here until the month of May, and are very comfortably installed in a very delightful private home as paying

guests of Felipe Telxidor, who also happens to be our landlord.
