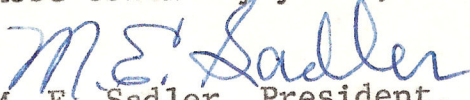
Our Society does not pay an honorarium, but we do pay all the travel and entertainment expenses of persons on our program.
