Almost 9 out of every 10 of our respondents (89.5%) who were asked by U.S. immigration officials about fear of being returned to Mexico responded by expressing fear of being returned to Mexico

But US authorities sent back almost 6/10 of them

- 63.9% of people who express fear (previous 89.5%), said that their prosecutors can find and have access to them in Mexico
- 23.1% of migrants have been threatened with physical violence while in Mexico as they await their immigration court dates
- 21.9% who are seeking asylum with children under the age of 18 have been threatened with physical violence while in Mexico

According to the report, expending more time in Mexico increases the risk of violence or homelessness.
