My Dear Sir,

I am in sympathy with the present Government in Mexico, which you helped form, and I believe you have millions of Americans thinking as I do. There is no doubt in my mind that the Viceroy Barbon Gen. Carranza always antagonized the Government of the United States. He may of had some good reasons of which I am not-aware. But I do know, it was poor diplomacy and poor policy.

Your bloodless revolution stands out plain, as a shining example, to the world, and more especially to Europe. It proves beyond doubt that

Let all the poor everywhere know the nature of this excursion. Give the people encouragement to extend a welcome to the Americans, make it a grand affair everywhere. This will do more than anything to bring both peoples back as neighbors once more.

No my desire to go to live in Mexico again and if I do I wish to see and meet the only General who whipped Villa in battle. Gen Obregon
