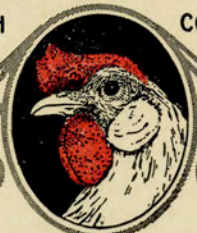

Dear Mr. Santander:-

Ever since the much appreciated visit of Mr. Malottky and yourself to Vancouver, I have been very busy in securing all possible information on the stock that our R.O.P. breeders could offer towards filling the important order that you placed with this Association. We have been in constant correspondence with our breeders - I have visited many of them personally, and am now in a position to state that we will be able to make early shipments of the following stock;

ALAN GEORGESON; 2 W.Leghorn cockerels from hen No. 19
3 do yearling hens do

M.L.HOMAN; 3 W.Leghorn yearling hens or pullets
from G.1296

I had great difficulty in persuading Mr. Homan to part with these very valuable birds but finally secured his consent, and am very pleased to state that the birds will go forward as ordered.

4 pedig. cockerels 331-338 egg. These will be carefully selected and inspected.

10 yearling hens R.O.P. 300-315 egg grade. In connection with this item, it may be necessary for us to include a few hens whose eggs have not averaged quite the 24 oz. on the days of the R.O.P. inspector's visit. If it would be acceptable for you to use hens whose records are certified in the returns made to the breeders by the Government but which have not passed for R.O.P. on account of egg size, but which are good hens in every other respect and free from standard disqualifications, we would be pleased to offer you these birds at reduced prices, e.g. we have these birds in the 300-315 egg class listed at \$50 - we will supply the hens whose egg weights have not come quite up to the 24 oz. standard at \$40 each, and amongst this list we will let you have 1 - 306 egg hen that is a remarkably fine layer. Included in the lot too will be one very fine 307-egg hen that was registered at the Agassiz Contest this last year.

Re the 50 yearling hens R.O.P. 290-299 egg record - we are having some difficulty in securing the required number of 50 hens with records as specified, and would ask you to let us include hens with records over 280 or possibly over 270 to make up the total number. Of course, the price for the hens with records over 280 would be lower, viz. \$25 each, and over 270 at \$20 each.

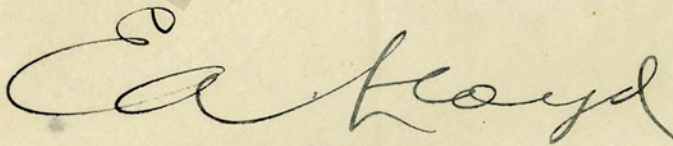
4 special hens with records 310-315 eggs at \$50 each - we hope to have this lot lined up in the near future.

We have a total number of 50 pullets reserved from hens with records over 290, and also a total number of 50 from hens with records of 300 and up.

I am pleased to state that we are certain of being able to supply you with very high quality stock to fill the main part of your order, and it is only in the two sections, viz. 10 yearling hens with records 300-315 and 50 yearling hens with R.O.P. records 290-299, where if you can give us a little more leeway allowing us to cut the records a little lower and supplying you with more hens at lower prices, we will be able to meet the specifications fully. I hope that such changes will not materially affect your breeding programme, and that we may be allowed to proceed to fill your order as I have suggested.

Dear Mr. Santander:-

We have secured further listings from our breeders for stock to fill the esteemed order placed by you for General Calles.

We now find that we have about seven 300-egg hens lined up for you and believe we will be able to get the 10. If we cannot secure a total of 10, 300-egg birds would you be able to accept three of the hens with records 297, 294, 292?

We are still some short on the yearling hens with records over 290 and would like to ask for the privilege of substituting some hens with records over 280 eggs.

Or, we could supply you with extra pullets from hens with records over 300 eggs.

Or, we could offer you quite a number of extra pedigreed pullets from hens with records over 290.

Upon reconsidering your order after having written you under date of November 23rd in which I suggested that we be allowed to substitute yearling hens with records below 290, I find that we have a considerable surplus of pedigreed pullets from the high record hens and thought perhaps you might be willing to accept these in place of the hens.

Our R.O.P. Inspectors are busy working on the selection of the stock at the present time and men are working on the shipping crates and we hope to be able to get a number of these birds away this week or next and are expecting them to go through in good condition.

Dear Mr. Santander;-

We regret that we were not able to get the total shipment of 197 birds, consisting of 6 special cockerels and 191 females, in one shipment. As advised in my telegram, we sent 164 birds in the 1st shipment on Dec. 20th, the 2nd shipment of 28 birds on Dec. 22nd, and the third and final shipment of 5 birds on Thursday, Dec. 27th. This last shipment was delayed on account of the illness of one of our breeders, Mr. W. Whiting of Port Kells, who is a veteran of the Great War, and is confined a good deal of his time in Shaughnessy Military Hospital. This delay really could not be prevented. These 5 birds went out in good condition on the 27th, however, and I feel quite confident that they will be satisfactory.

After a good deal of trouble we have succeeded in filling your order as specified with the following exceptions;

In the special cockerels from hens with records 331-351 eggs, we had to substitute a cockerel from Mr. M. L. Homan from his 300-egg hen in place of the cockerel that we had reserved with J. H. Mufford & Sons from their 332-egg hen. This bird is a special individual, and we believe has a pedigree that is equally as good as, if not better than, the Mufford bird, so that we believe he will be satisfactory.

We finally persuaded Mr. Homan to let you have 3 hens with records 292, 308, and 310 eggs from his special G.1296 line. Mr. Homan was very reluctant to part with these birds, and when I first put up the matter to him he absolutely refused. All the special birds, both Georgeson and Homan stock, were in first-class condition, and I am hoping that you will be well pleased with them. I would consider one of the hens from Georgeson to be the finest White Leghorn I have ever handled. She is of splendid size, long back and beautiful type, and lays eggs weighing 27 oz. to the dozen. Two out of three of these hens laid in the coop on her way over from Victoria, and their eggs are of good size and color, and shell texture. I am hoping that you will get some wonderful

results from these hens, and also from the 3 special Homan hens. These are birds which the breeders positively refused to sell to other poultry breeders who were trying to purchase them, and I consider it a matter of great satisfaction to have been able to secure these birds for you. Although they will be a great acquisition to the breeding industry in Mexico and to the splendid breeding stud of General Calles, they are at the same time a distinct loss to the poultry breeding industry of British Columbia, as such birds cannot be replaced.

Being short of 300-egg hens and also hens with records over 290 eggs, we were compelled to send some birds from hens with records over 270, over 280, and some extra 270 and 280-egg also 2 extra pedigreed pullets, in their places. We finally succeeded in securing 49 hens with records from 270 to 299 eggs, and have priced these at \$20 for the 270-egg, \$25 for the 280-egg, and \$30 for the 290-egg hens, and hope that you will consider these prices reasonable.

I was compelled, however, to make a few adjustments in prices in connection with some special birds.

In the case, for example, of Flowerdew, 2 pullets were included from his 282-egg hen that scored a high premium in points at the Canadian Contest at Ottawa when his pen won at Ottawa in 1927, and Mr. Flowerdew considers this to be his very best breeding hen, and her record at the contest of 282 eggs to be equivalent to that of a 310 or 315-egg hen here in B.C. Mr. Flowerdew would not care to take less than \$25 for these pullets, and on account of their special breeding value, I decided to include them in the shipment. I hope this will be satisfactory to you.

In the case, too, of the 2 pullets from Mr. Forsyth's 299-egg hen, I consider that if pullets from 300-egg hens are worth \$25 each, these pullets should be worth at least \$20 each, and have listed them accordingly.

Also in the case of the 3 pullets shipped by Mr. W.J.Gunn, I consider these to be superior individuals, and worth a little more than \$15 each. We accordingly listed these at \$20 each.

Regarding the 11 pullets shipped by C. W. Lawson, these are very uniform and of superior quality and breeding. They are particularly outstanding with respect to the egg size in his strain, which I would refer to your observation later. Mr. Lawson did not think he should take less than \$15 each for the pullets from his 282 and 288-egg hens since they are two of his best breeding hens, and we agreed with him. We accordingly listed all of his 11 birds at \$15 each, and believe that these are very reasonable at this price.

Again, in the case of Rump & Sendall, who consigned 4 pullets from their 298-egg hen, we had to pay \$20 each for these pullets.

Mr. J. W. Spence consigned 3 pullets from his 298-egg hen, which is one of his very best hens, and comes close to the 300-egg

mark. We secured these 3 at \$20 each. Mr. Spence considers his 299-egg hen I.16291 to be worth considerably more than \$30 if his 305-egg hen was worth \$50. We accordingly listed this hen at \$40, and believe that she is good value at this price.

Messrs. Holland & Son also consigned a pullet from a 299-egg hen, which we are listing at \$20 instead of \$15, and hope this will be satisfactory.

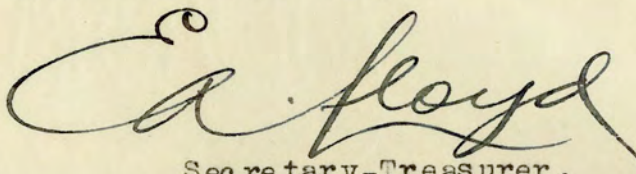
Now the total number of birds, as you will note, is 197 instead of 176 as originally ordered. We are hoping that the extra birds will represent full value for the 300-egg and the 290-egg hens in which we fell short. The total value of the order now comes to \$5,555. as per detailed list already mailed you, which we trust will supply you with the necessary information.

The R.O.P. inspectors found, and we also found, when the birds were finally assembled, that some of the pullets were a little thin and a few of them were a little smaller than we would want to see, but on the whole we considered them to be good, big, vigorous, healthy stock such as we believe will give a good account of themselves in Mexico. Some of the pullets are almost bound to moult after a trip of this kind, especially if they are going through the hot country in Texas and Northern Mexico.

We do hope, however, that all the shipments will arrive in good condition, and await your further reports with very keen interest.
