This letter will introduce Mr. Thomas A. French, Secretary-Treasurer of the Arizona State Federation of Labor, and Mr. C. N. Idar, a general organizer for the American Federation of Labor.

The Arizona State Federation of Labor has designated these gentlemen to lay before you important information in regard to the conditions surrounding some ten thousand Mexicans who have been imported into the Salt River Valley under contract to do agricultural labor for members of the Arizona Cotton Growers Association.

They speak with authority for the organized labor movement of this State. Any courtesies shown them by yourself or representatives will be appreciated and we will give most earnest consideration to any recommendations you may make in this matter.

It is the earnest desire of the Arizona State Federation of Labor and the men and women of the organized labor movement in the United States that a better understanding be established between the working people of the two Great Republics to the end that better conditions, greater freedom and prosperity attend the people of both countries, and that peace between us reign forever.
