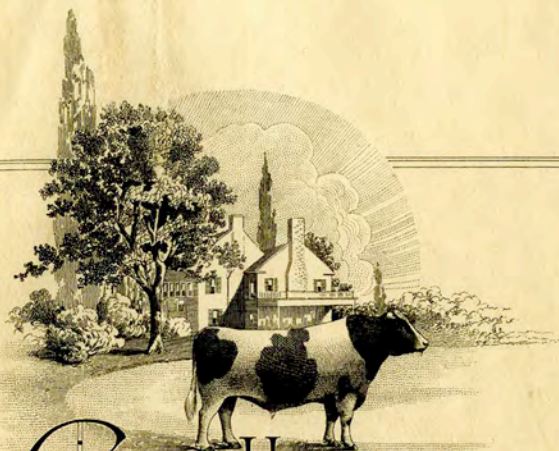

Muy Señor mio:

Como Vd. tiene interes en la crianza de vacas Holstein, por eso tomo la libertad de escribirle acerca de los grandes remates, que se efectuarán en este pais durante el año en curso. Uno, conocido bajo el nombre de Clark's Holstein Special, se efectuara en Fond du Lac, Wisconsin, el 26-27-28-29 de octubre de 1926. En esta venta 400 animales de los mejores Holsteines que se pueden encontrar en los Estados Unidos y Canada serán reunidos para la venta. El 5-6-7-8 de abril de 1927 en Fond du Lac, Wisconsin, se efectuara otra venta de 500 Holsteines bajo el nombre de Clark's Holstein Classic.

En abril de 1926 tuvimos nuestro primero "Holstein Classic". En esta venta 455 cabezas de Holsteines se vendieron a un precio medio de \$936 y 50 toros fueron vendidos a un precio medio de \$894 cada uno. El ultimo precio de \$15,000 pagó un Senor Canadiense por el toro Johanna Rag Apple Pabst. De los 455 cabezas que pasaran por el remate en los cuatro dias de la venta se vendieron 70 animales por \$500 cada uno 108 por precios que variaron de \$300 a \$500, y los demas de los animales se vendieron por poco menos de \$300 cada uno.

Los precios de los animales fueron determinados por los compradores atendiendo la venta como se venden los animales a la persona que ofreció mas. He indicado en el libro adjunto los precios a que se vendieron estos animales en el Classic de abril de 1926. Notará Vd. de esta lista de precios que habian muchos animales que se vendieron por menos de lo que se los pudieron comprar particularmente.

Tengo plena seguridad de que si Vd. piensa importar animales Holsteines de pura raza de los Estados Unidos que seria de ventaja suya atender o el Fall Special de octubre de 1926, o el Classic de abril de 1927. En estas dos ventas verá Vd. reunidos cuatro o quinientos cabezas de animales seleccionadas todos bajo un solo techo, asi ahorrando mucho tiempo y dinero para Vd. porque de otra manera Vd. tendria que pagar mucho dinero para ir a los cabanas a inspeccionar los animales.

Estos animales todos han sido inspeccionados antes de la venta por jueces competentes ya expertos en la cuestion y los son libre de defectos y de enfermedades. Las personas quienes compraron animales en el Classic de abril ultimo han quedado todos muy satisfechas con sus compras. En ninguna venta del pais podra Vd. encontrar tantos animales finos de un tip tan sobresaliente y con la produccion que ellos tienen.

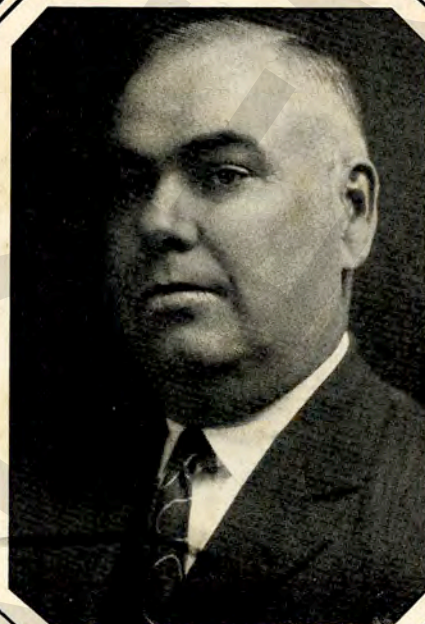

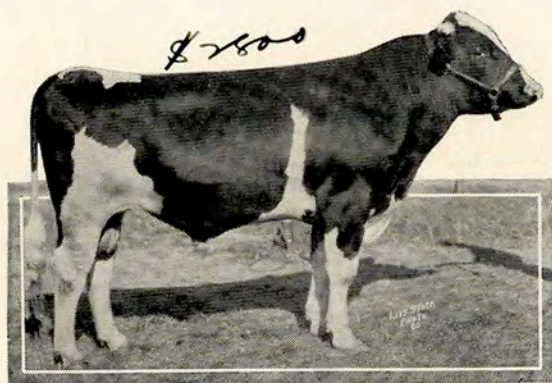

K. P. O. P. bred animals are invariably high testers. If you study the herd test and the numerous K. P. O. P. records, made at the fountain head of K. P. O. P. breeding, you will find that most of these tests will
