If this is not possible either for some technical reason or otherwise I shall be glad if I get the amount even in Paris and in which case I will like to know from where to collect it in Paris.
- 3. I have already completed the preliminary formalities and you will be sending me the air ticket shortly. I am to inform you that I propose to leave Varanasi on or about the 20th of January and the round trip ticket should be from Varanasi and back. I shall highly appreciate if I am allowed to take the route for the forward journey from Varanasi via Delhi, Berut, nome, Paris, London, New York, Mexico and tentatively for return journey Mexico, Sanfransisco, Honolulu, Tokyo, Bangokok, Dajkarta, Singapore, Rangoon, Calcutta, Varanasi.

If you have no objection I may start my return Journey on or about the 21st June, 1962.

Dear Mr. Pathak:

Thanks for your letter of November 7th, with the program and bibliography attached. I did not answer it immediately because I expected to receive few days later the Vice-Chancellor's letter, as you told me that the Executive Council was meeting next day, that is to say, on November 8th. We have not heard from him as yet, so we are still uneasy as to the final outcome of our invitation to you.

Since you are supposed to be here not later than February 3rd., there is hardly any time left but for some important measures we have to take without delay:
