

PRESIDENT OF MEXICO FRIENDLY

Obregon has been elected president of Mexico. He is thought to be friendly to the United States, and to believe that there can be no material economic progress in the republic to the south, unless it remain on amicable terms with the republic of the north. He will be the first chief executive of Mexico since the assassination of Madero to hold such views. Carranza was a man of considerable ability, but he was obsessed with a belief that the United States had sinister designs upon his country, and sought to control it.

Mexico is a country of boundless resources; it is a country that should respond to the influences of civilization; it is a country that should be the homeland of millions of prosperous and happy citizens.

But Mexico has never been a republic in the true acceptation of the term. The peons have no voice in government. Diaz was a dictator, with powers, influenced, but not limited, by an office-holding oligarchy. He did much for the industrial development of his country; nothing for its political emancipation.

Obregon, if he measures up to his new responsibilities, may live in history as the man who really freed the land and placed it in a position to command the respect of the world.

Obregon Is Elected President of Mexico in Today's Elections

Mexico City, Sept. 6.—Gen. Alvaro Obregon, candidate of the national constitutionalist party, won a decisive victory in the elections held throughout the republic today for the purpose of electing a president, according to scattering advices. His opponent was Alfredo Robles Dominguez, who was nominated by the national republican party. The vote is expected to be very light and no reports of disorders are expected. There have been reports that changes in the cabinet are imminent, but Miguel Elesso Robles, secretary to provisional President de la Huerta, declared last night that none of the present cabinet members had offered to resign and that the provision president of Mexico was not thinking of making any changes.
