Dear Mr. Fahs:

The old project of the Modern History of Mexico is quite over as far as research is concerned, and four-sixths over as to publishing, since the publisher already has in his hands the manuscript of volume IV. In fact, there only remains to be done the adjustment of the text of volumes V and VI so as to reach the final draft. This seems to be, then, the time to consider whether there is some other project worthwhile by itself and in whose achievement we may take advantage of the experience and knowledge so far gained.

A contemporary history of Mexico suggests itself as a logical sequence, but the sources for such a history are so abundant and scattered and their value so uneven, that it seems imperative to tackle first the question of the localization, evaluation and availability of those sources as a separate and independent project. The final goal would be to publish a guide to the sources of Mexican Contemporary History for the use and profit of any person interested in this period.

We believe that the work could be completed in two years by a team of five researchers, two of them working full time and the other three part time. The work has to be carried out not only in Mexico City, but in some other thirteen places, and in some fifteen American localities. The main expenses involved would be allowance for research, transportation costs and a per diem cost while travelling.

I am then submitting for your kind consideration this new project under the basis of your Foundation meeting two thirds of the cost of research and the entire cost of transportation and travelling expenses within the United States, while El Colegio will meet the remaining third for research and the cost

of transportation and travelling expenses within Mexico, as follows:



Dear Dr. Reyes:

I have the honor to inform you that at a meeting of the Executive Committee of The Rockefeller Foundation on February 21, 1957, action was taken providing up to \$27,300 to the Colegio de Mexico to be available as follows:

1. Up to \$18,300 for the purpose of locating, evaluating, and determining the accessibility of printed, manuscript, and testimonial sources for the history of the Mexican Revolution, 1910-1940.
2. Up to \$9,000 toward the travel expenses of Daniel Cosío Villegas and Señora de Cosío to enable them to visit European centers of Latin American studies and to spend approximately four months in Asia for the purposes of observation and lecturing.

Both grants are for use during the two-year period beginning July 1, 1957.

If it meets with your convenience, payments on the grant for the history of the Mexican Revolution will be made on a semi-annual

basis upon receipt at the beginning of each year of a budget for the project. We shall appreciate receiving also annual statements of receipts and expenditures. Arrangement for payment of the \$9,000 grant for the travel expenses of Dr. and Señora de Cosío may be made by writing directly to our Comptroller. It is our understanding that this fund will provide approximately \$4,500 for travel and \$4,500 for a per diem of \$25 during sixty days in Europe and one hundred twenty days in Asia.

Any balance of either of the funds unexpended on June 30, 1959, will revert to the Foundation.

A brief public announcement of this grant will be made in the next quarterly report of the Foundation. There is, however, no objection on our part to your announcement of the grant prior to the issuance of the Foundation's report if for any reason this appears to you desirable. In this connection I am enclosing, as a matter of routine, a printed statement of The Rockefeller Foundation policy regarding the announcement of grants.





1) No parece haber muchas dudas acerca de la importancia de una historia de la Revolución Mexicana, o, como convendría llamarla desde ahora, de una Historia Contemporánea de México.

2) Sin embargo, la existencia de una literatura abundantísima sobre este tema, literatura que además es variada y está muy dispersa, hace aconsejable y aun necesario atacar primero el tema de las fuentes para esa historia.

3) Este primer paso es tan necesario en sí mismo tan importante, que por razones de costo y de tiempo valdría la pena considerarlo como un proyecto independiente.

4) El proyecto tendría un triple objeto: localizar las fuentes (impresas, documentales y testimoniales), estimar su valor y juzgar de su disponibilidad.

5) La localización de las fuentes impresas es necesaria y no sería fácil por su abundancia, su naturaleza (muchas de ellas fueron publicaciones efímeras o meros panfletos) y porque no están concentradas en una biblioteca, sino dispersas en muchas, públicas y privadas.

6) La localización de las fuentes documentales será una tarea muy difícil, pero es necesarísima, sobre todo por lo que toca a documentos mexicanos, la inmensa mayoría de los cuales se encuentra en manos de particulares.

7) Es necesario también hacer una lista de las fuentes testimoniales, de aquellos personajes de la Revolución todavía vivos y que uno sabe que jamás dejarán escritas sus experiencias y opiniones.

8) La localización de las fuentes habrá de hacerse en México y en Estados Unidos principalmente.

9) No basta, por supuesto, localizar las fuentes, sino que es nece-

sario tener una idea lo más clara posible de lo que puede esperarse del estudio de cada una de ellas. El general Juan Barragán, por ejemplo, pasa por tener uno de los archivos más ricos de esta época; pero parece que es un archivo exclusiva o predominantemente militar y que se refiere sólo a lo que se llamó "Ejército Constitucionalista", es decir, aquel que siguió a Venustiano Carranza.

10) En fin, es necesario averiguar la disponibilidad de esas fuentes, pues en algunos casos no se podrá disponer de ellas en absoluto, en otros se podrá disponer de fotocopias y en otros sólo de los papeles originales.

11) Puede esperarse que dos años bastarían para este trabajo, a partir del 1 de julio de 1957, aun cuando se trata de una tarea muy laboriosa.

12) Puede suponerse que el personal necesario sería de cuatro personas, un jefe de grupo, que trabajaría tiempo completo, y tres personas más que trabajarían de 9 a 2 de la tarde.

13) El costo total en dos años sería de 12,000 dólares, repartido así:

1 jefe de grupo, a 200 dólares mensuales

3 ayudantes, a 100 dólares mensuales cada uno

14) El trabajo se haría bajo la dirección de Daniel Cosío Villegas, pero como no trabajaría él directamente, no habrá que pensar en ninguna retribución.

15) Habrá que considerar una suma de alguna importancia para viajes dentro de México y Estados Unidos.


