3. (SBU) IN THEIR AUGUST 24 PRESS RELEASE, THE RAPPORTEURS DESCRIBED THE SITUATION OF VIOLENCE AGAINST JOURNALISTS IN MEXICO AS "ALARMING AND INTENSIFYING." THEY NOTED THAT CURRENTLY THE NATIONAL HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION (CNDH) IS THE ONLY ENTITY THAT KEEPS TRACK OF CRIMES AGAINST JOURNALISTS IN MEXICO, AND CALLED THE LACK OF OFFICIAL GOM STATISTICS "TROUBLING." THEY FURTHER UNDERSCORED THE PROBLEM OF IMPUNITY, NOTING THAT THE SPECIAL PROSECUTOR FOR CRIMES AGAINST JOURNALISTS AT THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE (PGR) HAS NOT MADE AN IMPACT ON REDUCING WHAT THEY DEFINED AS "GENERAL IMPUNITY" FOR CRIMES AGAINST JOURNALISTS. THEY STRESSED THAT THE VAST MAJORITY OF AGGRESSIONS AGAINST LOCAL AND REGIONAL JOURNALISTS GO UNREPORTED DUE TO A LACK OF CONFIDENCE IN AUTHORITIES AND CHARACTERIZED THE STATES OF CHIHUAHUA, COAHUILA, DURANGO, GUERRERO, MICHOACAN, NUEVO LEON, SINALOA AND TAMAULIPAS AS "COMPLETELY SILENT" DUE TO DRAMATIC LEVELS OF MEDIA SELF-CENSORSHIP.
