Dear don Daniel:

Nothing is innocent in this world, especially in the field of bibliography. I am afraid we shall have to call on our good friends, the Mexicans, to help us out in getting some listing of official items. I wish we had for the United States the kind of compilation which Anita Kerr did for the Mexican ones.

Seriously, we have been looking into some of the problems your correspondence has posed. You will find attached a memorandum from Georgette Dorn, our Reference Librarian, together with some of the sample sheets of the Monthly Catalog of the GPO.

We are still a little unclear as to precisely what would be helpful. I more or less assume that you have covered nearly all standard sources, and now are seeking data on publications by the U.S. Government which do not deal with Latin American relations in general, but only would be helpful to you in your bibliography of Mexican foreign relations. Therefore such publications should have some relevance to Mexico. Nor are we fully clear what you consider "foreign relations." If these include economic matters, in addition to the normal political ones, and if they include matters like exchange of persons and other social relationships, then the circles are widened indeed.

January 18, 1965

As I believe I told you, Earl Pariseau, Editor of the Handbook, expects shortly to develop a modest project to see if we can get some control of U. S. Government publications on Latin America since about 1945, as the first step to a more comprehensive coverage of them. He has not yet presented me with a concrete proposal of what he intends to do, but I know that looking around for items of interest to you has stimulated his appetite to get at this important body of material.

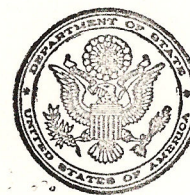

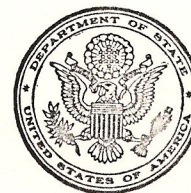
