Dear General:

I regret to inform you that Micha and I are being divorced. We both realize how unpleasant this news must be to you.

Micha in her letter has given you some idea of the problems which led to the mutual decision to part.

I must say that Micha has always conducted herself as a good wife and mother and that the failure of our marriage was predominantly my fault. Shortly after our marriage I had serious financial reverses and in order to overcome these and continue to progress in my profession, I found myself working twelve to fifteen hours and more daily, and for most of our marriage I took no vacations, so that Micha and Adriana were forced to vacation without me. In addition, my problems made me rather nervous and irritable at times so that this must have been unpleasant as well as difficult for Micha.

Micha plans to reside in New York for the next twelve months.

You can be assured that I will do everything within my capability to make them both comfortable and protected here. As long as Micha or I remain unmarried, my life insurance of \$50,000.00 is payable to her.

Mr. and Mrs. Robert P. Lamont who are very good friends of mine made a trip to Mexico with the purpose of settling there as farmers.

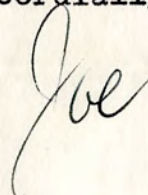
As you can see from the enclosed record, he has had a great deal of experience in farming and breeding.

Born - Chicago, Ill., 1897

A. B., Princeton University, 1919 (War degree)

Studied one year at University of Wisconsin College of Agriculture

Served as volunteer in the French Army, 1917. Awarded Medaille Militaire and Croix de Guerre with Palm.

1918-1937, owned and operated Perry Park Ranch, Larkspur, Colorado. General farming, pure bred cattle, and sheep.

During this period occupied at various times the following offices:

President, Western Hereford Breeders Association
Member of the Board, Vice-president, and President, American Hereford Breeders Association
President, National Western Stock Show Association
President, Western States Packing Company
Member of the Board, American National Live Stock Association

During the same period served as judge of beef cattle at most of the major national live stock shows, including Denver, Los Angeles, Portland, Des Moines, etc. Also exhibited Herefords at all of the major shows.

In 1932 was invited by the Soviet Government to make a survey of the live stock industry in Russia, and spent three months there for this purpose.

In 1937 entered the publishing business in New York.

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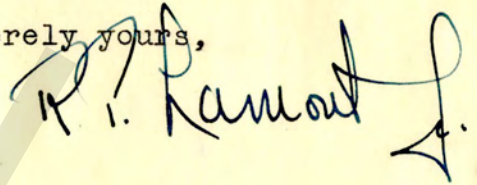
