

DECRETO SOBRE RELACIONES COMERCIALES  
CON EL ENEMIGO

"LA LISTA NEGRA"


La prensa se ha ocupado extensamente del decreto del Gobierno de E. U. de N. A. sobre relaciones comerciales con el enemigo, ya sea dentro o fuera de aquel país, y al efecto, se ha hecho circular una LISTA NEGRA dando a conocer los nombres de personas ó firmas comerciales en México, que se consideran como enemigos. Como en dicha lista aparecen firmas comerciales de importancia, tanto en este Estado como en Sinaloa, que de años atrás han cultivado relaciones comerciales con los agricultores de garbanzo; ya sea vendiéndoles mercancías ó comprándoles sus cosechas, he juzgado prudente dirigir á usted la presente circular, á fin de que se encuentre prevenido y antes de hacer alguna operación mercantil con firmas que aparezcan en dicha lista, tome la precaución de informarse sobre las consecuencias que puedan sobrevenirle en lo futuro. Por otra parte, la lista negra publicada aun no está completa y continuamente se agregan otros nombres.

Siendo nuestro país neutral en el gran conflicto Europeo, á simple vista nos ocurre que nada tenemos que ver con las disposiciones que dictan á diario los Gobiernos de los países beligerantes relacionadas con el aprovisionamiento de comestibles u otras medidas precautorias inherentes al estado de guerra en que se encuentran esos países, pero no debemos olvidar que los únicos mercados para nuestro garbanzo, en la actualidad, son los Estados Unidos y Cuba, ambos involucrados en el conflicto Europeo; y en tal virtud, al llevar nuestros productos á sus mercados, necesariamente nos veremos precisados á sujetarnos á las disposiciones que pongan en vigor, para su venta.

Me concreto por ahora, á citar el hecho de que cualquier agricultor que cultive relaciones comerciales con alguna firma ó individuo que aparezca en la "LISTA NEGRA" no podrá formar parte de la "Unión de cosecheros de garbanzo" pues si así sucediera, no podré yo, en representación de ellos, obtener sacos vacíos, fondos, etc. etc. ni hacer ninguna operación con sus productos en Estados Unidos, Cuba ó cualquiera otro país que se encuentre al lado de éstos combatiendo contra los Imperios Centrales.

Gentlemen:

Referring to attached application for Export License into Mexico, of 200,000 two hundred thousand empty jute bags, this is to inform that these bags are to be used exclusively in packing garbanzos (Mexican chick peas) which are to be harvested in Sonora and Sinaloa States during the coming months of May, June and July of the current year. The garbanzo in question is to be exported from Mexico to the United States, principally to New York, which market supplies that of Cuba and Porto Rico. The majority of the garbanzo farmers have appointed me as their representative for the sale of their crops, and, in that connection, I have agreed to acquire the necessary empty bags as well as to render them all possible help to attain the best result in the sale of their crops. For the information of that Board, herein below please find a list of garbanzo farmers, from Sonora and Sinaloa, who have favored me with their representation:

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## NOTES ON THE ENEMY TRADING LIST.

1. By section 3 (a) of the Trading with the Enemy Act persons in the United States are prohibited under penalties from trading or attempting to trade "either directly or indirectly with, to, or from, or for, or on account of, or on behalf of, or for the benefit of, any other person, with knowledge or reasonable cause to believe that such other person is an enemy or ally of enemy, or is conducting or taking part in such trade, directly or indirectly, for, or on account of, or on behalf of, or for the benefit of, an enemy or ally of enemy," except under license from the President. By section 2 of the Act "enemy," "ally of enemy," "trade," and "person" are given specific definitions which are not coextensive with their ordinary popular use.

2. The War Trade Board, to which the President has delegated the administration of the Act, publishes this List to give American merchants, bankers, shippers, and other notice that "trade" with the persons and associations whose names appear on it may involve a violation of the Act unless a license therefor has been granted by the Board in accordance with section 3 (a) of the Act. For the technical definition of "trade," reference is made to section 2 of the Act.

3. This is not a complete list of persons and associations with whom it is illegal to trade under the terms of the Act. Obviously it can include only those names concerning which the War Trade Board has sufficient information to justify listing. Therefore trade with a person or association known or suspected to fall within the prohibitions of the Act is not justified by the fact that his or its name does not appear on the List.

4. The revised edition of the Enemy Trading List, of which this is a supplement, entirely supersedes all lists, supplements, and announcements of changes published by the War Trade Board previous to March 15, 1918. This supplement is cumulative, and therefore supersedes all previous supplements to the revised List.

5. The listing of an "enemy" or "ally of enemy" partnership is equivalent to listing all the partners individually, as well as the association.

6. The listing of a member of a partnership as an "enemy" or "ally of enemy" applies against trade with the partnership as well as trade with the listed person.

7. The indication of an address for a name on the List, or in supplements to it, is not intended to exclude other addresses of the same person or association. Unless otherwise specified, a listed name refers to all branches of the business in the country.

8. In order to minimize, as far as possible, the inconveniences caused to American merchants by the dislocation of foreign trade through the operation of the Trading with the Enemy Act, the War Trade Board is collecting and classifying the names of nonenemy

firms who might be substituted for those within the prohibitions of the Act. A considerable amount of information already is available. In cases where the Board is not prepared to suggest a substitute firm, on request it will inquire of United States consuls abroad. If the applicant wishes this done by telegraph it will be necessary that he undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence.

The Board assumes no responsibility whatever for the credit or commercial or financial reliability of substitute firms. Its recommendations are confined to the character of the firms under the provisions of the Trading with the Enemy Act.

It will facilitate the work of the War Trade Board if applicants in making inquiries will specify the particular trades in which substitutes are required.

9. Supplements to the List, containing additions, removals, and variations, will be published approximately on alternate Fridays.

10. The Enemy Trading List and all supplements thereto are telegraphed immediately to the representative of the United States of America in each country abroad, who is instructed to notify all American consuls. Therefore persons abroad who wish to know whether or not a name is on the List should apply for information to an American consul. Firms in the United States of America which have agencies or branches abroad should furnish them with copies of the List and supplements as they are published.

11. The List and all supplements and revisions will be mailed as issued to persons whose names appear on the mailing list of the War Trade Board, Washington, D. C. Names and addresses will be added to this mailing list upon application.

12. The List and all supplements and revisions are published in pamphlet form and also in the Official Bulletin (issued daily by the Committee on Public Information, 10 Jackson Place, Washington, D. C.), which is for sale at \$5 per year, and in Commerce Reports (issued daily by the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce, Department of Commerce, Washington, D. C.), which is for sale by the Superintendent of Documents, Washington, D. C., or may be obtained at the district offices of the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce as listed below, at \$2.50 per year.

13. Copies of the List and supplements in pamphlet form may be obtained from the branch offices of the War Trade Board and the district and cooperative offices of the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce.

## EXPORT LICENSES FOR POSTAGE, REVENUE, AND OTHER STAMPS

THE WAR TRADE BOARD ANNOUNCE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE EXPORTATION OF POSTAGE STAMPS, REVENUE STAMPS, AND OTHER STAMPS OF SIMILAR CHARACTER, EITHER CANCELED OR UNCANCELED, WHICH AMPLIFY THE REGULATIONS ANNOUNCED MAY 14, 1918 (W.T.B.R. 109):

LICENSES MAY BE GRANTED FREELY AUTHORIZING THE EXPORTATION TO ONE OR MORE CONSIGNEES, WHOSE NAMES NEED NOT BE SPECIFIED ON THE LICENSE, OF A SINGLE PARCEL OR AN UNLIMITED NUMBER OF PARCELS OF CANCELED OR UNCANCELED POSTAGE STAMPS, REVENUE STAMPS, OR OTHER STAMPS OF A SIMILAR CHARACTER. SUCH LICENSES SHALL BE VALID FOR A PERIOD OF 90 DAYS AND FOR THE TRANSMISSION OF SAID STAMPS BY REGISTERED OR FIRST-CLASS MAIL ONLY. THEY SHALL NOT BE VALID FOR SHIPMENTS TO PERSONS ON THE ENEMY TRADING LIST.

THE PARCEL SHALL BEAR PLAINLY MARKED ON THE WRAPPER THE LICENSE NUMBER AND DESCRIPTION OF CONTENTS AND MUST BE ADDRESSED TO THE CONSIGNEE IN CARE OF THE POSTAL CENSORSHIP COMMITTEE AT EITHER NEW YORK CITY, N.Y.; KEY WEST, FLORIDA; NEW ORLEANS, LOUISIANA; SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS; SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA; SEATTLE, WASHINGTON; OR HONOLULU, HAWAII; AND THE SHIPMENT SHALL BE SUBJECT TO SUCH RULES AND REGULATIONS AS THE POSTAL CENSORSHIP COMMITTEE MAY FROM TIME TO TIME PROMULGATE. THE NAME AND ADDRESS OF THE CONSIGNOR MUST ALSO APPEAR ON THE WRAPPER AND THE POSTAGE MUST BE FULLY PREPAID TO THE COUNTRY OF FINAL DESTINATION.
