My dear Mr. President:

May I be pardoned for calling attention to your esteemed letter of June 23rd which I translate as follows:

"I have received your letter and telegram dated the 20th instant and I sincerely believe that prior to the coming month of July, it will not be possible for us to do anything in reciprocity of the work which your papers have been making in favor of my Country, but I do think that after that time our conditions might have improved and we will then be able to co-operate in a more efficient manner to such work."

I trust the conditions since July are as favorable as you anticipated in your letter.

I am conducting the work vigorously in behalf of the Republic of Mexico and I trust with the additional newspaper strength at Houston which I now control it is within your power and will meet with your hearty approval to afford me the desired cooperation.

I inferred from Mr. De Negri in my conversation with him as your representative in June 1921, that it would be the wish of your administration to disburse \$30,000 per annum in behalf of the publishing the advantages and opportunities of the Republic of Mexico. If therefore, it would be possible to make arrangements now for the disbursement of two years on that basis or in the sum of \$60,000 it would repay me for the large expense I have incurred in my newspapers during the last two years or since June 1922, and it will enable me to provide the additional expense I have incurred in the acquisition of the Houston Post-Dispatch, the only morning newspaper in the City of Houston and one of the most influential newspapers in any of the Cities of the United States.

I will deeply and sincerely appreciate your most liberal and generous aid at a time when the benefits will be of mutual advantage.
