Dear Dr. Cosio Villegas,

First of all I would like to tell you how very much I enjoyed meeting you and to thank you for your kindness during my brief visit to Mexico.

I am greatly interested in the possibility of participating in the International Relations Programme at the Colegio next year and intend to send you a suggested syllabus and bibliography for a course of lectures showing the role of Britain in the Western World. I wonder if, in the meantime, you would be good enough to have sent to me some more detailed information of the number and scope of the lectures; the point in the course at which they would have to be given; and, perhaps, a copy of one or two of the syllabuses (with bibliography) of courses already given as a guide to the general pattern of the programme.

I am returning to England in September and hope to complete my book on the Inter-American System in the New Year. I hope later to make a brief study (perhaps a long article or even something more ambitious) of the role of Mexico in the Inter-American System which is of particular interest to me.
