Announcement of Grants

Since its establishment, The Rockefeller Foundation has followed the practice of recording its grants in an Annual Report which appears early each year. The Foundation in this way seeks to fulfill its responsibility of accounting to the public for the current use of the funds it holds in trust. Consequently, the Foundation has no reason to ask that recipients make any announcement on their part. Recipients who wish to acknowledge the receipt of funds may do so either by routine reference or by similar listing in their annual reports. Where special circumstances make some further announcement seem desirable to the recipient, however, the officers of the Foundation would appreciate the opportunity of seeing such announcements in advance, whenever circumstances permit, and particularly when interpretation of the Foundation's action is involved.

The Foundation's action, in making a grant, carries implicit approval of the proposal for which the grant is made. It likewise implies full confidence in the recipient, who is responsible for giving effect to the proposal and for its results. Just as there is no expectation or desire on the part of either the recipient or the Foundation that such results be submitted to the Foundation for approval, so there should be no acknowledgment of the grant—as, for example, in the prefaces of books—which might imply or suggest that those results carry the specific approval of the Foundation. The Foundation particularly requests that its name should not be used on the jackets or in any advertising of books, or in designating projects, fellowships, laboratories, or buildings toward which it has contributed.

Dear Dr. Sandoval Vallarta:

Will you kindly let me know what the status is of the grant made by The Rockefeller Foundation of \$7,500, in favor of the National University's Institutes of Mathematics and Chemistry, concerning which I wrote to the Rector on June 29, with copies to you and to the Directors of the Institutes?

I have just returned from a long trip to South America, and do not find any reply from any of the persons concerned to the above-mentioned letter. I am told that there has been a change in the rectorship of the University, but do not have exact information concerning it.

May I call the attention of all concerned to the fact that the expiration date of this grant is June 27, 1945, after which time any unexpended or uncommitted balance remaining in the account will revert to The Rockefeller Foundation. If any difficulties now exist with respect to the agreed financial contributions from cooperating Mexican institutions, I should be pleased to be informed of this situation.

Copies of this letter are being addressed to the Rector, Universidad Nacional de Mexico, and to the Directors of the respective Institutes.

Dear Dr. Caso:

May I acknowledge your letter of November 17, concerning the grant of \$7,500 of The Rockefeller Foundation to the National University of Mexico, for the libraries of the Institutes of Mathematics and Chemistry.

This grant was made in cooperation with three Mexican institutions -- the National University, the Comision Impulsora y Coordinadora de la Investigacion Cientifica, and the Colegio de Mexico. The University and the CICIC, in the April 27, 1944 letter signed by Drs. Orozco D. and Sandoval Vallarta, agreed that the University, from its own funds or from a subsidy from the CICIC, would contribute 10,000 pesos to the Institute of Mathematics and 3,000 pesos to the Institute of Chemistry. The Colegio de Mexico, through Dr. Daniel Cosio Villegas, also agreed to provide, in cooperation with The Rockefeller Foundation, the sum of U.S. \$1,000 for the library of the Institute of Chemistry.

On September 30, 1944 the CICIC made a grant of 5,000 pesos to the University. Will you kindly advise me when the University has provided the sum of 8,000 pesos and when the Colegio de Mexico has released the amount of U.S. \$1,000? It will then be possible for me to secure authorization to approve bills submitted against the Foundation's grant of \$7,500.

In this connection I should advise you that the Directors of the Institutes should arrange for the purchase of library materials through a book dealer or other agent in the United States. When I was in Mexico last February I informed everyone concerned that this method of procedure should be followed, as our Purchasing Department is not able, because of depleted staff due to wartime conditions, to take on this work. A statement concerning the method of presenting bills to The Rockefeller Foundation was made in my June 29, 1944 letter to Lic. Brito Foucher, copies of which were sent to the President of the CICIC, to the Directors of the Institutes, and to Dr. Cosio Villegas.

I hope to receive early confirmation from you of the release of the local funds. Please do not hesitate to write me further, if necessary, although I think you will find all details in the correspondence which dates back to February 11, 1944.

Dear Dr. Caso:

Your letter of January 26 was acknowledged by my secretary, and when I had the pleasure of seeing you in early February in Mexico you informed me that the University had made its promised grants of 6,000 Mexican pesos for the library of the Mathematics Institute and 2,000 pesos for the library of the Chemistry Institute.

Since my return to New York I have seen a letter from Lic. Daniel Cosio Villegas, dated February 14, in which he renewed his assurances that the Colegio de Mexico would make its promised contribution of U.S. \$1,000 for the library of the Institute of Chemistry, in cooperation with the Several organizations contributing financially to the libraries for mathematics and chemistry. I sent off yesterday a night letter to Lic. Cosio Villegas, informing him that the CICIC, the National University, and The Rockefeller Foundation have made the agreed allocations, and requesting that he turn over to the University the \$1,000 representing the generous grant of the Colegio de Mexico.

The University has already received the CICIC grant, has itself set aside the agreed 8,000 pesos, will no doubt receive shortly from the Colegio de Mexico the above-mentioned \$1,000, and the \$7,500 grant of The Rockefeller Foundation is, as you know, available. Drs. Napoles Gandara and Orozco probably will, judging from my conversations with them in Mexico in February, follow somewhat different procedures in securing the desired books and scientific journals, one ordering from an agent in Mexico City and the other placing orders, in whole or in part, direct with the publishing houses in the United States or through an agent. It is a matter of indifference to the officers of The Rockefeller Foundation how the desired materials are secured, as the Directors have the liberty to make the best possible use of the joint funds.

The Rockefeller Foundation contribution of \$7,500 remains in New York, as was agreed, and we are prepared to approve bills bearing the certification of the Directors of the Institutes (\$5,000 for mathematics and \$2,500 for chemistry), covering purchase cost (and shipment and insurance charges if secured in the United States), until the sum of \$7,500 has been exhausted.

The expiration date of our grant still remains June 27, 1945, although payments do not have to be actually completed by that date, if the materials have been ordered. If it should prove quite impossible for the Directors to place all of the orders by June 27, and if you

inform me to this effect by the first of June, I believe that it would be feasible to extend the expiration date of the grant by a period of, say, three months.

May I thank you again for the most pleasant occasion on which we met in Mexico City in February, and may I also express the hope that your plans for the University will have full success.

Dear Mr. Reyes:

With much interest I have read your recent note on the proposals of Mrs. Ugarte for archival work. I am not prepared, I fear, to make general recommendations to the Trustees of The Rockefeller Foundation for archival studies on a large scale. On the other hand it would certainly be wise to use such a plan as Mrs. Ugarte's only within a general program such as the Archives might establish under long term plans.

There may be some reason why this particular work is of value to the Colegio de Mexico. In such a case, it would clearly be within the terms of our grant for the officers of the Colegio to take direct charge of this work within its own budget. At the moment that is the only response that I have of constructive kind. Probably you will find a much better answer in your own group. I hope that this is the case.


