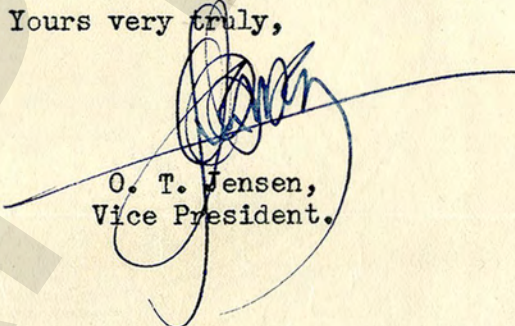

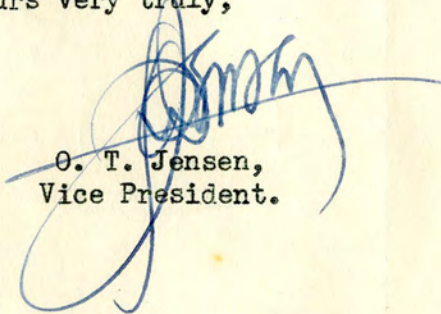

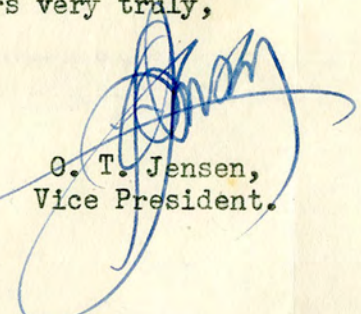
Since your indebtedness to this Bank is now considerable past due we have referred the matter of your delinquency to General P. Elias Calles.

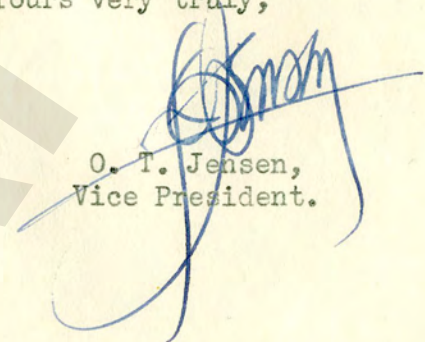
Dear General Calles:

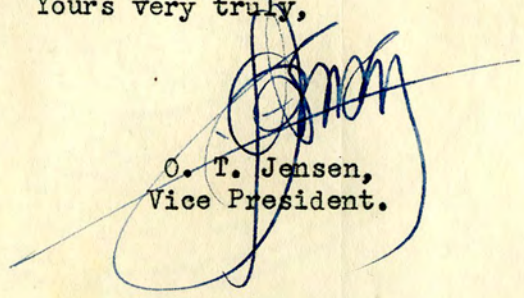
Today we received a check for \$44.50 from Mr. Meyer Katz covering interest on his loan of \$3,000.00.

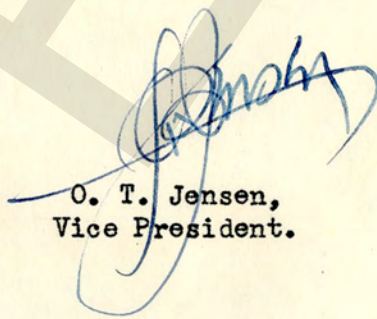

My attention has again been called to the fact that your note of \$3,000.00 is past due. This loan was made originally to you on May 31, 1939, and has been renewed every ninety days up to this time.

It is our decision that this loan has been carried as long as we should be asked to carry a commercial indebtedness. For this reason, it is necessary that we ask that you arrange for the immediate payment in full of the note and its interest.

Should you fail to do this it will become necessary for us to take appropriate steps to enforce collection. This, of course, we should dislike to do in that it will become necessary for us to bring action jointly against General Calles as well as yourself.

May I suggest that you give the adjustment of this obligation your immediate attention in order to avoid additional expenses and inconvenience.

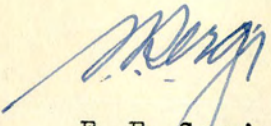

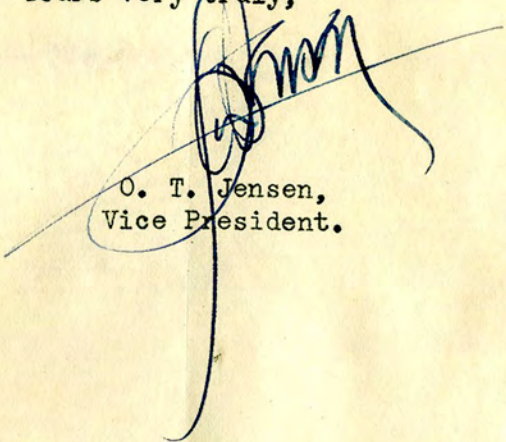

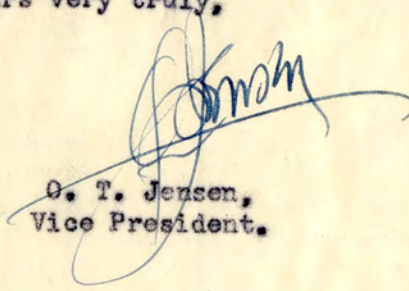
