Sirs:

Smith College has studied the suggestions submitted by the Colegio de Mexico, and writes to express its appreciation of the interest shown by the latter in plans for the Smith College Junior Group in Mexico.

Smith College would be glad to consider the negotiation of a formal contract for one year between the two institutions, on the following bases:

- a. The courses arranged by the Colegio de Mexico shall consist of thirty (30) weeks of classes, to be given in the period between November 1st and June 30th.
- b. So far as possible the subject matter of these courses, and the teachers, shall be agreed upon by the Colegio de Mexico and the Director of the Smith College Group.
- c. For a group of not more than twenty (20) students (Smith College will pay the Colegio de Mexico a total of twenty-five hundred (2,500) dollars, to cover full tuition for courses equivalent to the work of the Junior year at Smith and all other 4.85 cambi incidental expenses of material and adminis-tration. It is understood that the cost of excursions will be extra.

The program suggested by the Colegio de Mexico offers a satisfactory basis for selection to be made in accordance with the provision in b. above.


Dear Sir:
