F O R E W O R D

The following notes are aimed at helping the religious congregations and others making use of PERSONNEL REQUESTS LIST No. 1.

1. Purpose to be Served - The purpose is to provide a synthesis of personnel requests received from throughout Latin America, arranged according to the category of work involved. Indication of the country, diocese and civil community involved is provided in the heading for each description. The description aims to furnish sufficient information for a religious congregation to know in general: (a) the number and capacities of the personnel required, (b) any unusual characteristics of the location or people, (c) financial involvement when given.

It must be clearly understood that in no instance has there been any attempt to supply complete enough information here for a decision. For this, the original documents will be forthcoming upon request.

2. Data and Source of Request - Ordinarily only those requests are entered that have been presented by a Nuncio, Ordinary or other fully authorized agent.

3. File Data - The file data in this list refers to the files of the Latin America Bureau. Future lists may include references to data filed elsewhere.

The three dioceses touch on one another and comprise a homogeneous entity, known locally as the 'oriente venesolano'."
