Querido amigo Cline:

Supongo que estará usted informado que el Prof. Robert N. Burr me invitó para decir el próximo 28 de diciembre un breve discurso al grupo de historiadores latinoamericanistas que asisten a la reunión anual de la American Historical Association. El Prof. Burr me escribió el 29 de septiembre unas líneas indicándome que yo debía acudir a usted directamente para obtener los recursos necesarios al pago de mi viaje y gastos.

No quisiera ocultarle a usted que me desconcertó un poco esta indicación del Prof. Burr, porque habiendo sido él quien me invitó, parecería natural que él llevara hasta el extremo lógico esta primera gestión. No puse ningún reparo, sin embargo, dada la vieja amistad que nos une a usted y a mí. La única cosa que quisiera agregar es mi esperanza de que precisamente por ella piense usted en términos un poco más generosos de los habituales.

Creo haberle indicado a usted en nuestra última conversación que quizás me atreviera a acudir a usted para resolver un problema pequeño pero irritante. Por conducto de la American Book Store de la Ciudad de México encargué una colección completa de la reimpresión que hizo la Universidad de Florida de los 26 tomos del Handbook of Latin American Studies. La American Book puso a mi disposición, y naturalmente pagué, una colección incompleta, cosa que frustraba el único y verdadero motivo que me condujo a hacer un gasto tan considerable, o sea tener en mi propia biblioteca la colección completa que me permitiera acudir a ella en cualquier momento. He insistido con la American Book en que obtenga de la Universidad de Florida una información precisa de cuando va a tener a la venta esos tomos, con el resultado de una breve comunicación comercial de que han tomado nota de la orden de la American Book y que la surtirán cuando sea posible. ¿Usted, con la autoridad académica que tiene, y, por supuesto, con el buen deseo de servir a su amigo Cosío Villegas, quizás pueda obtener esta información, de la que dependen incluso planes concretos de mis trabajos de investigación? Le doy a usted la noticia de los tomos que me faltan: 15, 17, 18, 20 y 21.

This acknowledges your note of November 13, 1965.

The reason that Profesor Burr left it to you and me to arrange your travel is that I am Chairman of a Committee of the Conference which handles its grant funds on a relatively permanent basis, whereas the Chairman is an annually elected officer.

Naturally, I shall be more than happy to do anything that would be most convenient to you for covering expenses of your trip to address the Conference at its luncheon session in San Francisco. We can provide a travel advance, or reimbursement, whichever is most convenient. Looking forward to seeing you in the latter city soon,

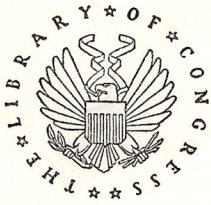

Thank you for your letter of December 28, which was on my desk when I returned to work on January 3. I had expected to be in Mexico on January 2, but like you, found that a number of matters converged to prevent my re-visiting one of my favorite capital cities.
