AMERICAN WOMAN KILLED IN MEXICO.

TOURISTS ATTACKED.

(FROM OUR CORRESPONDENT.)

NEW YORK, AUG. 29.

A band of robbers has attacked a party of tourists in Mexico near the towns of Ixtlan and San Marcos, in the State of Jalisco. One American woman has been killed and her body mutilated. This region is infested by bandits. Dispatches state that the authorities immediately ordered troops to pursue the culprits.
